Nancy O'Brien (Academic Senate)	Generally agree but have concerns about budget implications and the need to carefully define the position responsibilities.
Drew O'Bryan (Student Sustainability Leadership Council)	The Coordinator will fill a much-needed role in researching and promoting sustainable transportation.
Kevin Duff (OBFS)	This is also a good idea but very difficult to pursue given the University's budget
